^{*} The Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) is a standardized developmental screening instrument for ages 4 months to 5 years. The ASQ consists of 19 forms, each specific to an age range e.g. 11-13 months. The ASQ is the developmental screening tool selected by the Hawaii Interagency Screening Task Force for children from birth to age three. ASQ psychometrics are adequate for a screening tool: Sensitivity (percent of delayed children correctly identified) ranged between 51% (4 months) to 90% (36 months) [cf DDST (Denver) II: 56%-83%]. Specificity (percent of normal children correctly identified) ranged from 81% (16 months) to 92% (36 months) [DDST II: specificity 43% - 80 %]. Test-retest reliability over two weeks was 94%; interobserver (parent and examiner) reliability was 94%.
