## **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES FOR KONA EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES PROGRAM**

### INFANTS AND TODDLERS (0-3) WHO ARE DEVELOPMENTALLY DELAYED

Developmental delay means a delay in one or more of the following areas of development: cognitive, physical (including vision and hearing), communication, social or emotional, or adaptive development.

### INFANTS/TODDLERS WITH BIOLOGICAL RISK FACTORS

Biological risk means prenatal, perinatal, neonatal, or early developmental events suggestive of biological insults to the developing central nervous system which increase the probability of delayed development. These children have a diagnosed physical or mental condition that has a high probability of resulting in developmental delay. A *few* examples are children with Down Syndrome, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, sensory impairments, gestational age under 32 weeks, very low birthweight (1,500 grams or less), and infants born to mothers with diabetes or a substance abuse history.
